

Healthy Aging Prize for Asian Innovation

In the next 30 years, the number of people 65 and up in East and Southeast Asia is expected to double. Rapid population aging requires creative approaches from both the public and private sectors in the region to meet the wide range of challenges it presents and to create vibrant, healthy, and resilient societies where people can enjoy long and productive lives.

Launched in 2020, the Healthy Aging Prize for Asian Innovation (HAPI) recognizes innovative policies, services, and products from Asia that address the challenges and opportunities of aging societies, help extend healthy and meaningful lives, and improve the provision of care to older adults.

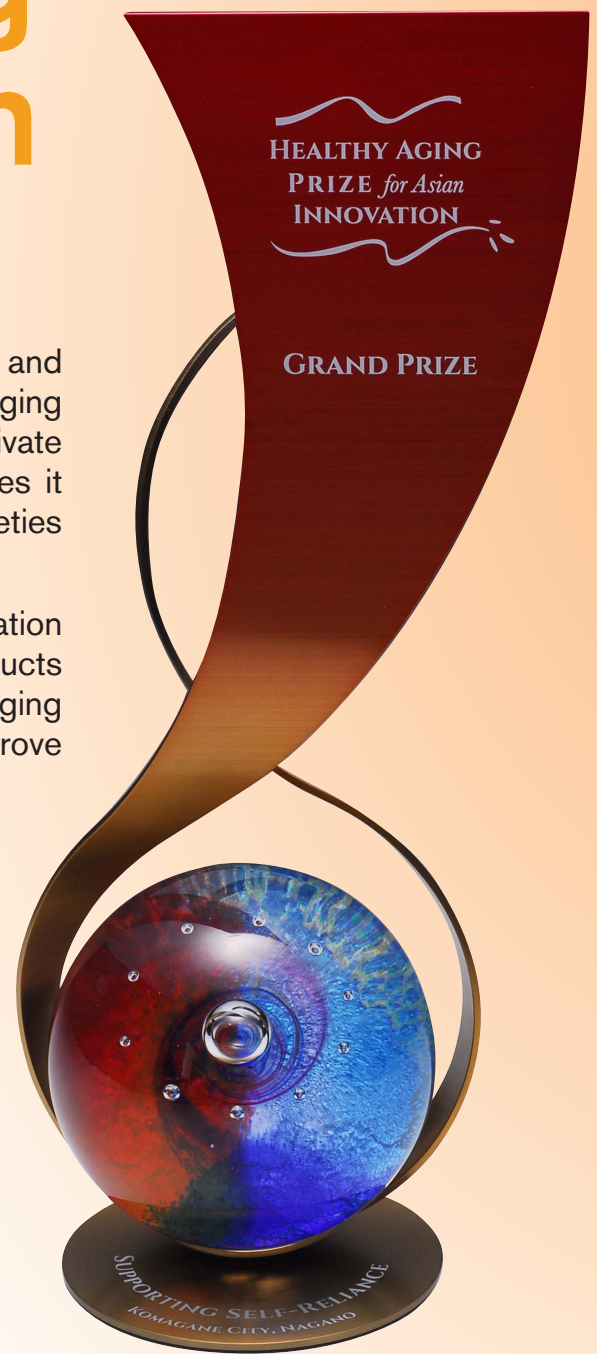

Award Categories

Technology & Innovation

New technologies and techniques that encourage healthy and productive aging, that improve the way that older persons receive care, or that provide greater efficiency, safety, and/or convenience for older persons and caregivers

Community-Based Initiatives

Community-based approaches—including inter-generational approaches—to keeping older adults healthy, active, engaged, and/or safe

Supporting Self-Reliance

New ways to help older adults maintain, improve, or restore physical and mental functions, that assist them and their caregivers as those functions deteriorate, or that build resilience



Eligibility

Eligible innovations include policies, programs, services, and products implemented by community organizations, nonprofit organizations, research institutions, local governments, private businesses, public-private partnerships, and social businesses based in an ASEAN member country or in China, Japan, or South Korea.
